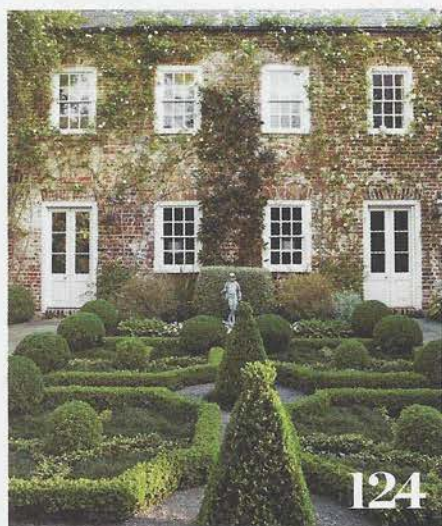

After a highly anticipated and buzzed-about launch in 2012, Aerin Lauder, Estée's granddaughter, is not content to rest on her laurels. For her second home accessories introduction, Lauder has continued to use plenty of gold and brass but this time added textured naturals like snakeskin and shagreen to soften the edge and lend exotic flair. The collection ([aerin.com](http://aerin.com)) includes generous-sized trays, beautifully crafted jewelry boxes (complete with velvet linings), clever hostess gifts like brass wine stoppers and wicker-handled bar accessories, and gold-tipped shells. In addition to home items, she also presented a colorful shoe collection of strappy heels, flats, and pumps.



## Frank Ponterio

Chicago-based interior designer Frank Ponterio collaborated with artisans at Avrett to create his latest collection, debuting this winter. The 11 pieces—ranging from light fixtures to tables—are made to order and boast brilliant textured finishes and hand-hammered metalwork ([frankponterio.com](http://frankponterio.com)).
